This vessel was purchased in January last by Messrs Thos. Dunlop & Sons under the "Scrap and build" scheme, and they stated she would not be trading again. She would shortly be disposed of for breaking up.

The vessel arrived at Leith on the 9th January, and is still laid up there.

The 3rd S.S. Act became due in February 1935, and the year of grace has now expired.
