Dear Sirs,

I duly received your letter of yesterday's date respecting the steamer "AIKLEAP", and note that negotiations are now in hand with a view to this vessel being sold to foreign buyers.

With regard to the proposal that the vessel might be allowed to proceed to a port abroad, probably Greek, with cargo, I have to say that you will be in order in issuing an interim certificate for this voyage, provided the vessel be submitted to a general examination, as set forth in Circular No.1605, including, in this instance, a complete Boiler Survey and Tailshaft Survey, and a satisfactory report thereon be received. It is understood, of course, that the overdue 2nd Special Survey No.1 is to be completed on arrival at her port of destination.


I shall be glad if you will let me know immediately ^{when} any further developments take place in the matter.
