Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs
temporary repairs previously effected remain efficient,
recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and
that I have Recommended that she be eligible to remain as
classed, without fresh record of survey, subject to the vessel
being dry docked for examination and to permanent repairs being
effected to the starboard side shell plating also to the after
peak bulkhead, on discharge of the cargo it is now intended to carry.

The Special Survey (2nd S.S.No.5) due in February 1936,
should be carried out before the expiry of the year of grace,
being fit to carry a coal or other suitable cargo from the United
Kingdom to a port or ports of discharge in the Mediterranean.


