The 2nd S.S. No.3 became due 4,33 and action in this case has been deferred from time to time, the vessel being laid up.

The case received consideration on the 26th ultimo when a proposal to allow the vessel to proceed to Italy, for breaking up purposes, with a non-perishable cargo was agreed to, subject to the vessel being generally examined and favourably reported upon.

The Falmouth Surveyors now report the vessel surveyed float and a general examination made of the holds, tween decks, beams, machinery space, bunkers (as far as practicable), weather decks, tunnel, hatchways, casing, windlass and steering gear with satisfactory results.

It is submitted action be deferred, the Genoa Surveyors advised and requested to inform this Office when the work of demolition has been commenced.
