Surveyed the Steel Screw Steamer "TACOMA" 6838 tons gross of
HongKong, as she lay in Merewether Drydock, Bombay, for damage
alleged due to grounding in the Red Sea,

and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's
Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all ^{temporary} repairs
recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and
that I have Recommended that she be continued in her present
class viz :- 100 AI Shelter deck with freeboard without fresh
record, subject to shellplating between wind and water being scaled
at next drydocking and 15 fathoms of cable being repaired and
retested,
being fit to ~~sail~~ proceed to Japan to be broken up.
