Italian Ship Believed Scuttled

The Italian ship Marzocco (5,100 tons) is believed to have been scuttled off the East Scottish coast. Thirty-one members of the crew were landed at a British port and taken in charge by the military.

The fishing boat Hope saw two ship's lifeboats a few miles off the coast, drew alongside and discovered that the occupants were Italian.

A rope was thrown out and the Italians made fast, both boats being taken in tow.
