Dear Sirs,

With reference to your letters of the 30th ultimo and 19th instant regarding the stiffening of the main deck of the S.S.No.576 now being built to your order by Messrs. Barclay, Currie & Co., Ltd., and to your representative's call at this Office regarding the possibility of general cargo being carried at times on the second deck whilst chilled meat is suspended from below, I have now pleasure in returning herewith the sketch showing an arrangement of additional wood pillars and girders which you state has been satisfactorily fitted in previous vessels belonging to your firm, and which can be used in the present instance when a double load is carried on the 2nd deck beams.

The arrangement indicated on the sketch has been carefully looked into and, in the circumstances, is considered satisfactory, provided the fore and afters under the deck be increased and the bottom of the pillars be additionally supported as amended on the sketch.
