"SAXICAVA".

The first Special Survey No. 3 became due 9.34. A modified survey was held at Singapore in September 1935, and the Committee agreed to the S.S.No.3 being postponed until the end of last month.

"MUREX".

The class is subject to the rudder mainpiece (E.W. 12.32 and 12.34) being specially examined at the next dry docking. The riveting of starboard shell plating at deep tank forward in way of doublings, and permanent repairs to A strake of shell plating require to be dealt with at the Special Survey.

In October last a modified survey was held at Rotterdam, and the Committee agreed to the vessel's class being retained until the end of last month.

The Owners now write that the above vessels have been sold to Japanese Owners for breaking up purposes, and that they were handed over on the 26th and 27th ultimo respectively.

It is submitted "To be Broken Up" be recorded in the Register Book in respect of both vessels.
