Précis of particulars of Casualty

This vessel left Kushiro on the 29th October, 1934, bound for Dairen. She was reported to have been in wireless communication with the Poshan Station on the 2nd November, when a message was received to the effect that she was in distress in lat. 35.40 N, long. 131.20 E.

Although thorough search was made, no trace of the vessel was found, & it was presumed that she had foundered.

The Kobe Surveyors stated, in a letter dated 12th December, they were informed by the Owners that the vessel was now officially recorded as a total loss.

In consequence of no information having been received, closing entries were made at Lloyd's on the 24th March, 1935.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

OVERDUE VESSEL

YEIRYO MARU.—London, Nov. 12.—The following cable has been received from Tokio, dispatched at 1.47 p.m. to-day: Steamer Yeiryo Maru, laden with sleepers, left Kushiro on Oct. 29 for Dairen. Nothing has been heard since the morning of Nov. 2 when she was in lat. 35.40 N., long. 131.20 E. By owners' request steamer Yusho Maru was dispatched from Moji yesterday afternoon to search.

YEIRYO MARU.—Tokio, Nov. 14.—Steamer Yeiryo Maru is reported missing in the Sea of Japan. Although destroyers have assisted in the search for her, no trace of her whereabouts has been found.—Reuter.

YEIRYO MARU.—London, Dec. 5.—The following cable has been received from Tokio, dispatched at 7.16 p.m. to-day: Steamer Yeiryo Maru now considered foundered; search abandoned. (See issue of Nov. 13.)

YEIRYO MARU.—London, Jan. 4.—The following advices have been received from Tokio, dated Dec. 10: The salvage vessel Yusho Maru has since made every effort in searching for the steamer Yeiryo Maru in the area between Okishima and Tsushima, but unfortunately came back to Moji on Nov. 14 without any result. It has, however, since been reported that several pieces of sleepers and logs of cargo, broken pieces of the bridge and one life-jacket, which no doubt belongs to this vessel, had been picked up by some passing steamers some 60 miles east of Okishima and therefore, considering the severe weather when she was last heard of we presume she went down with all hands. YEIRYO MARU.—London, Feb. 22.—In reply to inquiry, Lloyd's Agents at Dairen write under date of Feb. 7: The only message we can find with reference to the steamer Yeiryo Maru was received at 7.20 a.m. on Nov. 2 last at the Poshan Station, advising that she was in distress, but since that date no trace of the vessel has been found. (See issues of Nov. 13 and Dec. 6.)

UNTRACED VESSELS

London, Mar. 27.—In consequence of no information having been received of the following vessels since the dates given, closing entries have been made to-day against their names in Lloyd's Records:

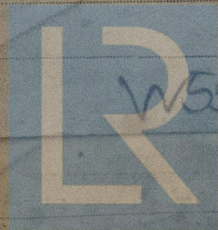
