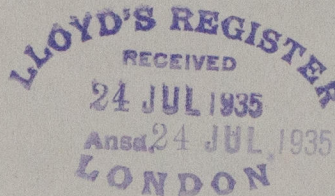

The findings of the Court were delivered this morning and from the point of view of the Society were, we think, entirely satisfactory; Mr. Watt was present and will have reported fully to you, and we shall obtain and send you, possibly this evening and in any case tomorrow morning, a full print of the findings and annex thereto.

For the moment, therefore, it is sufficient to say that the Court found that the vessel was seaworthy in every respect at the commencement of her last voyage; the arrangements for the accommodation of the crew were criticized in some respects, but it was expressly stated that these criticisms in no way affected the seaworthiness of the ship. In the annex it is stated that the oral evidence of the surveyors, taken in conjunction with the repair accounts, left no doubt in the mind of the Court as to the fact of the vessel's seaworthiness, and we think that this indicated that the Court was satisfied with the way in which the surveyors' evidence had been given.
