## SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

FRATERNITY.—Cleveland, Ohio, May 15.—Consolidated Marine steamer Fraternity sank near Richelieu in 25 ft. of water, supposedly result of burst sea-cock. Decks partly submerged.—Salvage Association's Surveyor.  
FRATERNITY.—London, June 24.—In reply to inquiry, Lloyd's Agent at Montreal writes under date of June 12: The steamer Fraternity sank on May 5 while laid up in winter quarters, and she is still there. I have been in communication with the Salvage Association, Great Lakes Department, here, but no arrangements so far have been made for raising her. (See issue of May 17.)

This vessel was reported to have sunk in 25 ft. of water on 5th May while laid up in winter quarters near Richelieu, and arrangements for raising her were made. Her decks were partly submerged.  
A casualty notice was sent to the Owners on the 28th June, but sufficient time has not elapsed for a reply to be received.  
The Montreal Surveyor states, however, that the vessel is a total loss; will be broken up shortly; & encloses a copy of a letter received from the Owners in confirmation.
