

Dear Sirs,

With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of your steamers "SAN LAMBERTO" and "SAN TEODORO", which have now been laid up at Falmouth for some time past, and in connexion with which you have been good enough to furnish a letter of undertaking in respect of the Special Survey No.3 in each case, I beg to refer you to your letter of the 16th January last in which you stated that it was possible that these vessels might never go into commission again.

In the circumstances, I shall be glad if you will kindly let me know, for the information of the Committee, whether you have yet arrived at any definite decision in regard to their future employment, as in the ordinary course a general examination should now be held with a view to their classification being allowed to remain undisturbed in the Register Book, whilst laid up.

I may explain that in cases such as these, it is usual for the Committee to require a general examination if the vessels continue to be laid up when a Special Survey is more than two years overdue, with a view to a report being

furnished as to whether their condition is such as to warrant their classes being continued.

If these vessels continue to be laid up indefinitely it is concluded that you will raise no objection to their being submitted to a general examination by the Society's Surveyors, but I shall be glad to hear from you on this point in due course.
