The Boiler Survey became due on this vessel at the end of September last and the Second Special Survey No.2 will become due at the end of the present month.

On the 24th instant, the Liverpool Committee had before them a report from the Local Surveyors, from which it appeared that upon examination of the vessel afloat for Freeboard purposes, considerable repairs were found necessary to decks, framing, bulkheads etc. The Surveyors reported that after discussion it was decided to scrap the vessel, and she has been sold 'as and where' she lies to German Buyers as a hulk for breaking up purposes. Having regard to the repairs found necessary, the Liverpool Surveyors recommended that her class should be dealt with at once.

The Liverpool Committee, on the 24th instant, decided to refer the case to the General Committee, and it is submitted that, in the circumstances, a casualty notation of 'To be broken up' (which automatically cancels the vessel's class) should be made in the Register Book.
