Précis of particulars of Casualty

This vessel is reported to have left Venice on the 1st February, with a crew of 20 men, bound for Rouen via Gibraltar, & nothing has since been heard of her.

A lifebuoy with the name "Catalonia" has been picked up & wreckage which is believed to belong to the vessel has been found at Cape Gargano, just north of Bari.

In consequence of no information having been received closing entries were made at Lloyd's on the 28th June.

A casualty notice was sent to the Owners on the 3rd July, but no reply has been received.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

OVERDUE VESSELS

CATALONIA.—London, Feb. 16.—The owners of the steamer Catalonia cable that they have received no report of the vessel since she left Venice on Feb. 1 for Rouen. She was to have called at Gibraltar for bunkers.

London, Feb. 16.—In reply to inquiry, Lloyd's Agents at Gibraltar telegraphed to-day: Steamer Catalonia not arrived; we have no news.

CATALONIA.—London, Feb. 17.—In reply to inquiry asking for news of the Swedish steamer Catalonia, which left Venice on Feb. 1 for Rouen, Lloyd's Agent at Malta cabled to-day: We have no news.

CATALONIA.—Gothenburg, Feb. 19.—Steamer Catalonia, of which nothing had been heard since she left Venice on Feb. 1 with a crew of 20 men bound for Rouen via Gibraltar. To-day the owners received a telegram from Bari saying that a lifebuoy with the name "Catalonia" upon it has been picked up.—Reuter.

CATALONIA.—Gothenburg, Feb. 20.—According to information received by the owners of the Swedish steamer Catalonia this morning, some wreckage has been found at Cape Gargano, just north of Bari. The wreckage consists of an upper bridge and a smashed lifeboat, and it is thought that they may have belonged to the steamer Catalonia. The master of the Swedish steamer Caledonia reports that a heavy NW. gale was blowing in that neighbourhood on Feb. 3.—"Goteborgs Handels och Sjöfarts Tidning." (See issue of Feb. 21.)

CATALONIA.—London, Feb. 27.—The owners of the steamer Catalonia, Venice for Rouen, cargo pitch, state that during the period Feb. 16 to Feb. 19 some wreckage, consisting of part upper bridge and broken lifeboat, flagstaff, light supporters, two lifebelts, hatchway battens and mast has been found on the east coast of Italy. This wreckage is supposed to have belonged to the Catalonia.

UNTRACED VESSELS

London, June 27.—In consequence of no information having been received of the following vessels since the dates given, closing entries have been made to-day against their names in Lloyd's Records:

Catalonia, steamer, of Gothenburg 1512 tons gross, which left Venice on Feb. 1, 1934, for Gibraltar and Rouen.
