"PEARLSHELL", 5834 tons gross, whilst placed in Wilton's  
Pontoon at Schiedam, in order to examine propeller and  
sternbush, same being damaged by a rope whilst the vessel was  
entering the harbour of Raval on the 14th of Dec. 1930.

Found upon examination propeller blades damaged at tips, and  
sternbush flange worn down, and fastening bolts broken off.  
Recommended to replace the machinery in the same good and  
efficient condition as it was in before the casualty occurred  
to dress up propeller blades, and to build sternbush flange up  
and renew fastening bolts.-

The above repairs have been carried out as recommended and  
duly reported to Lloyd's Register Office, London.
