REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR

Carrying oil in the deep tank.

This tank is over No. 7. double bottom tank and the four manhole doors in that tank have been replaced by bolted plates jointed with asbestos tape. Tank tested by water pressure and found tight, bolted plates over manholes examined from tank underneath. All instructions complied with.

Chief engineer states vessel is already fitted for carrying oil in double bottom tanks Nos. 1, 2, 3 & 8.

Air pipes from deep tank fitted with suitable gratings. Nothing done at this time towards repairing shell plating on No. 4 Bow. (Special Remarks List.)
