Steam Trawler "RIGHTWAY"

With reference to your letter of the 9th instant enclosing debit note in respect of fee £5: 5: 0 for damage survey held at Aberdeen in July 1931, we beg to state we are informed by the Secretary of the Crater Steam Fishing Co. Ltd. that Mr. T.T. Irvin, one of the Company's Directors, is resident at Aberdeen and he presumes that the Society's Surveyors have been in touch with the gentleman in question. He states, however, that he himself has received no instructions to pay the account referred to nor any communication on the subject.

He also informs us that he has no record of the original account and further that he is unable to understand the circumstances in which a survey was carried out by the Society's Surveyors, in view of the fact that immediately upon the casualty the Owners relinquished possession of the vessel, she being in their opinion a total loss, a contention which was subsequently confirmed by arbitration.
