Dear Sirs,

I enclose herewith a debit note for £5:5:0 being the amount due for damage survey held at Aberdeen in July, 1931, on the Steam Trawler "RIGHTWAY", and with regard thereto I shall be glad if you will be good enough to arrange for a call to be made upon the Owners, who are resident at your port, with a view to the collection of this outstanding amount.

For your information I think it well to add that the vessel was posted a casualty in the Register Book, and I have since been informed that she was to be broken up.

In March last, the Aberdeen Surveyors reported that the Owner promised to attend to the matter as soon as possible, and, in a letter received today, the Surveyors say :- "the Owners' local representative now states that he will again write to the Owners, the Grater Steam Fishing Co., Ltd., North Shields, asking them to settle this account". The Surveyors add that a personal visit from the local Surveyor to the Owners may get this matter settled.
