### UNDERTAKING CASE

The 2nd Special Survey N° 3, which became due in February, 1932, has been partly held.

The vessel has been laid up & the Owners stated, in a letter dated 2nd March, 1933, that in view of the negotiations which were in hand regarding the sale of the vessel, they were unable to furnish the usual undertaking.

In a further letter received from the Owners, dated 26th September, it was stated that she had been sold to Messrs J. Cashmore & Co., of Newport, Mon., for breaking up purposes.

The Newport, Mon., Surveyor now states, in a letter dated 11th January, 1934, he is informed by the new Owners that the work of demolition commenced on the 7th December last & will be finished in about a month's time.
