Dear Sirs,

Reverting to your letter of the 22nd ultimo respecting the fees for the survey during construction of the s.s. "MUREX" I have to inform you that an account has now been rendered to the Admiralty for the survey of the hull, and for the assignment of freeboard, viz:-

First Entry.....	£ 9: 0: 0
Special Survey.....	518:12: 6
Expenses.....	57: 7: 0
Freeboard.....	11: 0: 0

As regards the fee for the machinery, this has been dealt with in the same way as for the Sister Vessel "HABSA", viz:- the fee has been calculated on the Nominal Horse Power of 522, and as the Donkey Boiler in this case is of the same type as the main boilers, the proportion of the total fee for the survey of the boilers, viz:- two-fifths, will be sub-divided into equal parts for each of the four boilers, which gives a fee of £10:14:3 for each boiler. In view also of the fact that part of this vessel's machinery was constructed at H. M. Dockyard at Chatham under the survey of the Society's Surveyors at this Port, it has been decided to credit this Office with one-third of the proportion of the total fee due for the survey of the engines, viz:-£14:5:8.

The allocation of the total fees will therefore be as under:-
