Dear Sirs,

I have to inform you that the Q.S.S. "BERENGARIA", now at your port, has been under survey at Newcastle-on-Tyne with a view to classification with this Society, and to complete the same the following remains to be done:-

Bottom and rudder to be examined in dry dock, anchors and chain cables to be ranged and examined and markings noted, chain locker to be examined, fore and after peak tanks, trimming tanks and double bottom tanks (except those in boiler space) to be examined internally and tested by water pressure, space under engine room and shaft tunnel floor to be cleaned and examined, side tanks forward (forming double skin) to be scaled, examined and coated, ~~and~~ watertight doors, other than those in the engine and boiler space, to be examined.

I shall therefore be glad if you will be good enough to give the case the necessary attention, and on completion of the work to your satisfaction, to forward a report on Form No.8 with a view to the classification of the vessel.
