Sir,

On the 1st April last we were requested by the Cunard S.S. Co, to examine ^{Section} No. 2 of main boilers, consisting of 12 water tube boilers. The boilers were examined on the 5th April, as requested, but, as the vessel was the property of the Cunard S.S. Co, and not the Shipping Controller, we raised the question as to the classification of the vessel.

We understand this question has been discussed between the head Office of the Cunard S.S. Co, in Liverpool, and you, but owing to the fee demanded is not likely to be settled.

Under the circumstances we would be pleased to learn what fee should be charged for the survey of the No. 2 section of Main boilers (one visit).

The vessel has been laid up in this port since the end of March but is advertised to sail for New York on the 18th inst.
