Précis of particulars of Casualty

This steamer is reported to have sunk off Ushant on 26th September after apparently striking submerged wreck.

A casualty notice was sent to the Owners on the 2nd October, but no reply has yet been received.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

GRONANT ROSE.—Brest, Sept. 27.—British steamer Gronant Rose, coal, reported sunk south of Ushant. Crew saved and landed here.

GRONANT ROSE.—Brest, Sept. 27.—Steamer Gronant Rose, of Liverpool, was sunk to-day in a fog off Pierres Vertes. The crew were saved.—Reuter.

Brest, Sept. 27.—The British collier Gronant Rose, Cardiff for Brest, sank last night south of Ushant after apparently striking submerged wreck. The crew, numbering 13, took to the boats and all safely reached Conquet, whence they came on here.—Reuter.
