

TOYO STEAMERS No.190 "TENYO MARU" & No.191
"CHIYO MARU".

We beg to enclose herewith the original test certificates for the chain cables for these steamers, which were supplied by us to the Builders at Nagasaki, also letters to Messrs M. Samuel & Coy, of London, from the Toyo Kisen Kaishai & copy of letter to the General Manager at Nagasaki from Mr. G. T. Aitken, Surveyor to Lloyds Register at Nagasaki.

These papers explain themselves & it is with regret that we have to ask your kind assistance in this matter.

It appears to us that the Manager of the Chain, Cable & Anchor Department (who has since left the employ of our Coy) overlooked or disregarded the fact that a small difference did exist in the weight of these cables for both vessels, otherwise the matter would have been put right before the cables were shipped on being brought to the notice of our Directors. The difference is very small considering the large size of the cable, & we hope no difficulty will arise in granting us the necessary letter of indemnity asked for by the Toyo Kisen Kaishai in their letter of Sept. 18th.
