Gentlemen,

With reference to Newcastle report No.52996 of survey held on the turbines made by the Parsons' Marine Steam Turbine Co.Ld., for the new vessel No.191 building by the Mitsu Bishi Dockyard & Engine Works, I have to acquaint you with regard to the fees to be charged in this case that if the whole survey had been completed in this country the fee for survey would be charged on a Nominal H.P. of  $\frac{1}{2} \left( \frac{16800}{6} + \frac{37661}{12} \right) = 2970$ , viz:- £168-10-0.

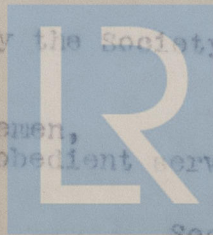
A fee of £48-10 has been charged for the survey of the boilers at Glasgow, and it is considered that a fee of £50 should be charged by you for your survey of the turbine engines. I have therefore to request that you will collect this amount.

I may remind you that in a letter dated 23rd February 1906 Messrs.Brown, McFarlane & Co.Ld., of Glasgow, stated that they had written Messrs.Parsons informing them that they would be responsible for the payment of the fees, but that doubtless Messrs.Parsons would arrange to pay the Society in the usual manner.
