Dear Sirs,

I was duly favoured with your letter of the 30th ultimo, and note your remarks regarding the case of the steamer "HUNTRESS".

With reference thereto I may say that it is quite true that the vessel came under the inspection of the Society's Surveyor at Durban in July, and that certain communications passed between him and this Office as to the condition of the vessel; and, with the consent of the then Owners, (Union Government of South Africa - Railways and Harbours Administration) these communications were exhibited to you, so that you had full knowledge of the preliminary proceedings.

The final survey of the vessel was held on the 22nd September, and the Surveyor's final report and recommendations were received in this Office on the 20th October, and were in due course submitted to the Committee.
