
Dear Sirs,

I have received your letter of the 27th instant, with reference to the case of the s.s. "HUNTRESS", which you have purchased from the Government of South Africa, and note what you say on the subject.

The Report of the survey held on this vessel by this Society's Surveyor at Port Natal from the 21st July until the 22nd September was received in this Office on the 20th instant, and has been before the Classing Committee, and as it appears from the Report that owing to her general condition she is unfit to carry dry and perishable cargo, and is therefore no longer eligible to retain the 100A1 Class, the Committee have decided, after very careful consideration of the case, to give instructions for the vessel's class to be expunged from the Register Book with a red line, and this decision will be submitted to the General Committee for confirmation at their Meeting on Thursday next, the 30th instant.
