I duly received your letter of the 22nd instant respecting the steamer "HUNTRESS", and in connexion with this case I may say that the Committee had under consideration at their meeting today a report of survey held on this vessel by the Society's Surveyor at Port Natal from which it appears that owing to her general condition she is unfit to carry dry and perishable cargoes.


In these circumstances, as the vessel is no longer eligible to retain the 100A1 class, the Committee have given instructions for her class to be expunged from the Register Book with a Red Line.

As regards the point you raise as to the attitude taken up by the Underwriters regarding the insurance of the vessel's cargo, I am not in a position to furnish you with any further information and can only refer you to the Underwriters concerned.
