

S.S. "BALTABOR"

Urgent

The Owners wrote on the 29th March that the above vessel was to be placed in dry dock at Reval for examination after having been ashore on Nagen Island in the Baltic since December, and in accordance with their request Mr. J. S. Butler, one of the Senior Ship Surveyors on the London Outdoor Staff, was instructed to proceed to Reval to hold a survey.

Mr. Butler left for Reval on the 31st March and returned to London on the 19th April (a period of 18 days), his total travelling and incidental expenses amounted to £8-6-2.

It is considered that a suitable fee to be charged for Mr. Butler's services would be £5-5-0 per day, making a total survey fee of £94-10-0.

With the addition of the expenses the inclusive would be £152-16-2, but it is thought if an account were rendered to the Owners for £150 it would be satisfactory.
