Précis of particulars of Casualty

This steamer stranded near Schielenhorst, Gulf of Danzig on 11th January, and it was subsequently reported that she had broken in two and had been abandoned as a total loss.

Casualty notice was sent to the owners on 21st January, but no reply has yet been received.

SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

BALTARA.—Danzig, Jan. 11.—British steamer Baltara, bound for Danzig, ashore in the neighbourhood of Helgoland, will probably get off without assistance.

Danzig, Jan. 12.—British steamer Baltara still ashore. Salvage agreement arranged on the basis of "no cure, no pay." Tug(s) failed to tow vessel off.

BALTARA.—London, Jan. 12.—The owners of the steamer Baltara have received a message from Danzig as follows: Baltara, lying east entrance Weichsel River N.W. 1½ miles from shore, draught forehead 18 ft., aft 10 ft., heavy starboard 25 degrees list, wind northeasterly, strong N.W. gale advised by Observatory therefore decided go alongside save passengers and crew. Master considered position great danger, starboard ports all broken and under water. Steamer may break up at any time. Wirelessed Danzig President of Police owing to immediate danger ship must be left under his guard but ship and cargo to be kept at our disposal, crew to return when safe. All passengers and part crew saved our tug. Master and rest of crew taken by salvage tug, all souls safely landed Danzig.

Danzig, Jan. 13.—Steamer Baltara ashore Schielenhorst, 25 degrees starboard list. Tug(s) failed to tow vessel off. Passengers and crew brought ashore yesterday, but bad weather hinders operations. Weather to-day slightly (mitigation). Further attempts will be made to get her off as soon as possible. Understand approximately 50 tons cargo on board. Sea pounding steamer, bulleyes damaged.—Lloyd's Agents.

Danzig, Jan. 14.—British steamer Baltara, blowing a gale with snowstorm. Ship listing. In a critical position.

BALTARA.—Danzig, Jan. 14.—Efforts to refloat the steamer Baltara, owned by the United Baltic Corporation, and carrying 43 passengers and a crew of 40, which went ashore last Friday (Jan. 11) about 2000 yards from Schielenhorst at the mouth of the Vistula, while on her way from Libau to Odyna, have been unsuccessful owing to the heavy snow-storm which has been raging. The vessel is considered a total loss. Passengers and crew have been brought here. It can be seen quite plainly that the back of the Baltara is broken amidships, and her forepart is completely submerged. Reuter.

Danzig, Jan. 14.—Steamer Baltara lies aground sand Schielenhorst, off mouth Weichsel. Since Friday night weather very bad, gale, snow storms. Efforts made tugs no cure no pay unsuccessful. Operations suspended due weather. Steamer pounding heavily and driving, bulleyes (?) broken, making water, position critical, last reported 25 deg. starboard list, now shifted port list. Inspection tug sent this morning not yet returned. Master and crew brought ashore Sunday (Jan. 13.) Suction dredgers if needed possibly available. Will telegraph after return inspection tug—Lloyd's Agents per Salvage Association.

Danzig, Jan. 14.—Steamer Baltara: Inspection tug returned, reports position appears hopeless. Large crack visible neighbourhood engine-room, water washing over fore and aft, very strong wind N.N.W. Salvage Association.

London, Jan. 15.—The owners of the steamer Baltara have received the following cable from Danzig: Baltara appears to be breaking up, position apparently hopeless. Still blowing north-west gale with tremendous seas.

BALTARA.—Warsaw, Jan. 15.—Steamer Baltara, which went ashore at the mouth of the Vistula yesterday broke in two. The ship had been abandoned as a total loss.—Reuter.

Danzig, Jan. 15.—Steamer Baltara. Weather still very bad. Extended fracture showing distinct signs breaking up.—Salvage Association.

BALTARA.—Danzig, Jan. 16.—Steamer Baltara. Consider total loss. Parted between engines and boilers approximately 50 ft. separating two portions, 40 deg. list starboard, sunk in sand main deck under water low side. Lloyd's Open Form signed with Weichsel, who propose endeavour save all possible under same contract. Endeavouring obtain offers for vessel as she lies but prospects poor as vessel sinking in sand.—Salvage Association's Special Officer.

BALTARA.—Danzig, Jan. 19.—Steamer Baltara. Operations still suspended owing weather conditions.—Salvage Association.

BALTARA.—Warsaw, Jan. 22.—The Maritime Court of Danzig, which has been considering the cause of the wreck of the British steamer Baltara at the mouth of the Vistula on Jan. 11, found yesterday that the cause of the grounding of the ship was the strong current and the fog prevailing at the time. At the same time the Court considered that the master of the ship was not entirely free from blame in that he did not, in spite of the fog, carry out the necessary soundings. Blame was also ascribed to the builders of the vessel for not having furnished the ship with certain requisite instruments.—Reuter.
