The class is subject to the rudder mainpiece, repaired by electric welding 7,25, being specially examined at the next dry docking.

The 2nd S.S. No.3, due 8,27, has been partly held and the Owners have furnished the usual undertaking.

In September last the Owners were informed that as the special survey became due so long ago as August 1927, and as the vessel appeared to be still laid up, with no immediate prospect of being again placed in commission, the Committee did not see how they could agree to her class being retained in the Register Book indefinitely.

The Committee would, however, be willing to allow the vessel's class to remain undisturbed for a further period of twelve months, provided a general examination be made by the Society's Surveyors, and the steamer be found to be in good condition. Such general examination would thereafter be required annually for the maintenance of the vessel's class in the Register Book whilst she was still laid up, until the next periodical survey (3rd S.S. No.1) becomes due in August 1931, at which time it would be necessary for the 2nd S.S. No.3 to be held for the continuation of class.

The Newcastle Surveyors now report a general examination made afloat.


All holds, decks, hatches, casings, ventilator coamings, masts, rigging, general equipment, bunkers, engine and boiler spaces examined, ceiling over bilges and insulated hatches lifted and
