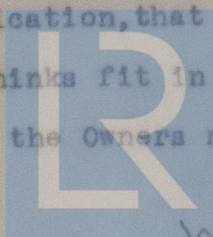
Dear Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 7th instant, regarding the Steam Trawler "LOCH NEVIS", owned by the Boston Deep Sea Fishing & Ice Co. Ltd., and enclosing one from that firm in reference to the transfer of this trawler from the British Corporation to this Society's class, in which they request acceptance of part of the survey already carried out by the British Corporation Surveyors.

I shall be glad if you will inform the Owners that it would be quite contrary to the practice of this Society, and entirely out of conformity with the principle which has gained for this Society its reputation among Classification Societies, to accept part of a survey carried out by anyone but its own duly appointed Surveyors.

At the same time it might be pointed out to the Surveyor carrying out the Special Survey No. 3, which will be necessary for classification, that he should exercise his discretion as far as he thinks fit in the examination which he has to make, so that the Owners may be caused no undue expense.
