With reference to the summons served upon certain of the Society's Surveyors to attend and give evidence at the Formal Investigation into the loss of the tanker "LA CRESCENTA", it is understood from the Board of Trade that in each case the witness was paid a fee for giving his evidence and also his 1st class return railway fare from his station to London. As, after all, the attendance of the Surveyors was not necessary, the Board of Trade request that the cost of the railway journeys might be refunded, although the witnesses may retain the fees which were given them. The Board of Trade desire that each of the Surveyors will return the relevant amount to the Receiver of Wreck from whom he received it, so that the correction may appear in the accounts of the relevant Receivers of Wreck.

I shall be glad if Mr. Jackson will be guided accordingly.
