R. With reference to my letters of the 18th and your replies of the 20th instant respecting the Steam Trawlers "FLINT CASTLE" and "MACLEAY", I beg to acquaint you that the Committee have had the cases of these vessels before them, and I am directed to inform you that, after consideration of all the circumstances, they feel that, consistently with the course followed in similar instances, records of the strandings of the vessels should be made against their names in the Register Book, as described in my letters referred to above.


