Dear Sirs,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 2nd instant respecting the request you have received from the late Underwriters of the quadruple screw steamer "BERMUDA" for recommendations to be made to entitle the vessel to a certificate to allow her to be towed to a port in Europe.

In the circumstances of this case it has been considered desirable that Mr. Sneddon should join you in the preliminary survey with a view to ascertaining whether the certificate required can be granted, and I telegraphed you to this effect today as follows :-
