

Dear Sir,

A request has been received from the late Underwriters who are now the Owners of the Q.S.S. "BERMUDA", lying here damaged (See Belfast Report No.10,761) to know the recommendations which would be made to entitle the vessel to a Seaworthy Certificate to allow her to be towed to a Port at present defined as "in Europe". It is understood the intention is there to remove the machinery and break up the vessel, the Port to which she is to be towed being one suitable for the purpose.

In these circumstances and in view of the action of the Committee following the receipt of Belfast Report No.10,761 not being known, and as the vessel is also structurally ineligible for classification, I should be glad to know whether this work is to be undertaken. As in the meantime arrangements have to be made, the favour of a wired reply is requested.



It has been arranged provisionally for preliminary investigations to be made with the view to forming an appreciation of what strength remains in the hull of the vessel and under what conditions of load - hull and machinery and ballast - she will need to be placed in order to proceed.
