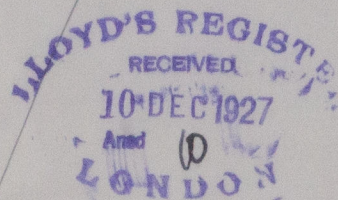

We beg to acknowledge receipt of your telegrams

"BERMUDA YOUR FIRST ENTRY REPORT NO 9872 WIRE
WHEN FEES PAID"

and have to confirm our reply to the first telegram as
follows:-

"REGRET NO TRACE OF SUNDERLAND REPORT 29487 IN THIS
OFFICE SUGGEST IT MAY HAVE BEEN SENT WITH PLANS
AND PAPERS PER PARCEL POST".

With reference to the Sunderland Report No.29487
we beg to state that it would appear this report was not
handed to the clerk for transmission with the Belfast First
Entry Report No.9872. We have been in communication by
telegram with Mr Annear who replies as follows:-

"ALL PAPERS BERMUDA NOT GIVEN TO CLERK IN ENVELOPES
IN OFFICE DRAWERS"

A thorough search has been made and no trace can be found of the report in question, but it is thought it might have been sent forward together with the plans and papers belonging to ~~this~~ vessel which were despatched by parcels post on Wednesday. In the absence of Mr Annear we are unable to offer any further explanation in this matter, but it is hoped that the above suggestions will result in the report being found.
