"HAMMERSHUS" of Genoa, ex "HAMMERSHUS" of Copenhagen, 3939 tons gross, while the vessel was lying afloat at this port after having grounded on the Lynette ground on the 30th November 1931 when on voyage from Leningrad to Liverpool and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have Recommended that she be continued as now classed T100A1 SPAR DK without fresh record of survey subject to the vessel being further examined in dry dock at the first convenient opportunity ~ The vessel being fit to carry a cargo of coal from Danzig to Venice. The Tail shaft of this vessel became due for survey in January 1933, but the survey has been postponed.
