Supplementing my letter of yesterday, I have just had an interview with Mr. Wilkie and find that the examination held on the forward boiler as per Liverpool Report No. 102246 is to comply with your letter to the Owners of the 10th April, intimating that boilers which were to be occasionally used on laid up vessels would require to be generally examined.

This boiler only will be used, if required for harbour purposes during the time the vessel is laid up and in the circumstances an account for £.1: 0: 0: i.e. half the usual scale fee has been rendered to the Owners today.
