It sometimes occurs that large steel castings intended for use in classed vessels, which have satisfied all the tests prescribed by the Society's Rules and have been reported upon favourably by the Surveyors, have afterwards been found to be unsound by reason of the existence of cavities and cracks in them.

In the circumstances, I have to request that you will be good enough to take this matter into your careful consideration, and report, for the information of the Committee, what additional tests you would suggest should be applied to steel castings in order to discover defects which the tests at present applied do not reveal.
