Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 21st instant, regarding the new cables which were to be placed on board the S.S. "MOORISH PRINCE", recently built by Messrs Short Bros, Sunderland, I beg to acquaint you that we are advised by the Sunderland Surveyors that the new cables have been examined by them and the marks compared with the certificates and that they witnessed them being placed on board a lighter for transport to the Tees.

The new cables were placed on board and stowed in the locker on the 22nd instant, it not being ^{considered} necessary to advise this office owing to the cables having been ranged and examined at Sunderland.

Mr. Dippie has, however, seen the cable this afternoon being worked with the windlass and has taken an account of the markings which will be compared with the certificates of test upon their receipt from the Owners tomorrow morning (to whom they were sent direct from the Sunderland office), and we will wire you in the morning after having identified the cable.
