## Précis of particulars of Casualty

*This steamer is reported to have struck a submerged rock in dense fog in Vazon Bay, Guernsey on 3rd June; top mast only visible. On 5th June it was reported that the vessel had broken in two, and was a total loss.*

*A casualty notice was sent to the Owners on 27th June, but no reply has yet been received.*

## SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

**GLENCREGAGH** — Guernsey, June 3. — British steamer Glencregagh, owner Peters, 129 Redcliff Street, Bristol, master Phillips, cargo empty hampers, which left Weymouth at 3 a.m. for Lezardrieux, struck a submerged rock in dense fog N.W. coast of island, Vazon Bay, at 11.45 this morning. Ship totally submerged; probable total loss. Master and crew saved in own boat. — Lloyd's Agent.

**GLENCREGAGH** — Guernsey, June 5. — Steamer Glencregagh completely submerged, top mast only visible. Will visit wreck with surveyor low tide to-day and telegraph for further. Vessel lies among rocks, dangerous tideway, about one mile from land and two miles north of Hancis lighthouse. Salvage very doubtful. Endeavouring obtain contract. No cure no pay. — Lloyd's Agents per Salvage Association.

**GLENCREGAGH** — Guernsey, June 5. — Steamer Glencregagh. Survivors report vessel broken halves. Total loss. — Salvage Association.
