Date:— October 5th, 1925.

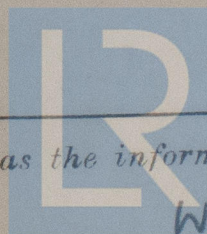
I am advised by the Bureau of Navigation, Washington, that this vessel is a "total loss due to stranding off Sandy Hook, N.J., January 20th, 1925".
