Précis of particulars of Casualty

*While lying at anchor at Leixoes on the 19th December, this vessel was run into by the s/s "Loanda". The "Orania" was badly holed amidships (port side) & heeled over & sank in the middle of the harbour.*

*She was later reported to be submerged at high water, with an inclination of about 83° to port.*

*A special casualty letter was sent to the Owners on the 15th February, & in reply they stated that, as they had abandoned the vessel to the Underwriters on the 22nd December, she was no longer their property.*

*Upon inquiry it has been ascertained that the vessel has been accepted by Lloyd's Underwriters as a total loss.*

### SOURCE OF INFORMATION.

**ORANIA**, Oporto, Dec. 18.—Portuguese steamer LOANDA, when entering Leixoes, collided with Royal Dutch steamer Orania, inside harbour. Orania listed to port, passenger being taken on, and efforts being made to beach her.

Oporto, Dec. 19.—Dutch steamer Orania now sunk inside Leixoes Harbour. Vessel lies on her side, half submerged; passengers and crew displaced.

London, Dec. 19.—The owners of Dutch steamer Orania, Buenos Aires, Amsterdam, report that the vessel collided outside Leixoes with Portuguese steamer LOANDA. Former steamer LOANDA sank in harbour, all her cargo.

Oporto, Dec. 19.—The Dutch liner Orania was rammed and ship and crew within three minutes by the Portuguese steamer LOANDA when entering Leixoes harbour. The Orania is now obstructing the entry of all but smaller vessels.—Reuter.

**ORANIA**, Leixoes, Palmira, Dec. 19.—Dutch steamer Orania: Position unchanged, master has requested our assistance and we are co-operating. Salvage vessels Valkyrien and Beskytten expected to-morrow. Strongly recommended you send Special Officer immediately. Cargo about 3000 tons, some being washed out. Steamer LOANDA left harbour, damage if any, unknown.—Lloyd's Agents, Oporto.

London, Dec. 20.—The following cable has been received from Lisbon, dated Dec. 19: Salvage steamer Valkyrien reported Leixoes to sink at Dutch steamer Orania, sink in harbour.

Oporto, Dec. 20.—Dutch steamer Orania, with at number 14, Leixoes, was run into by Portuguese steamer LOANDA, entering port. LOANDA rammed Orania, holed her side, Orania heeled over and sank in middle of harbour. Loss on being holed about 35 ft. water, Orania submerged presumably resting bottom. Cargo about 3000 tons, some being washed out. Salvage steamer Beskytten expected to-day. Recommended you send special officer immediately co-operating with master and agents.—Lloyd's Agents per Salvage Association.

The Salvage Association have patched an officer to this case.

Lisbon, Dec. 20.—The port officials at Leixoes today began consideration of the problem of refloating the steamer Orania, as her present position is a danger to navigation. The hole in her side is over nine yards long.—Exchange Telegraph Company.

**ORANIA**, Oporto, Dec. 20.—Steamer Orania: Position unchanged, master awaiting arrival of owners' representatives, expected to-morrow. Meanwhile await arrival of salvage steamer Valkyrien to ascertain what proposed prospects salvagers and your officer and other salvors. Meanwhile impossible to reach Orania in steamer.—Lloyd's Agents per Salvage Association.

London, Dec. 21.—The following cable has been received from the Swiss Salvage Company, Copen-hagen, dated Dec. 21: Following received from our master, Steamer Orania has 3000 tons mostly perishable cargo, vessel lying flat on damaged port side, inside harbour, heading towards entrance. Salvage above patches has water exposed in sea and swell. Cargo probably completely spoiled by oil and water. Salvage, if possible, will be long lasting and expensive.

Our salvage expert and technical superintendent Leixoes, due Leixoes Monday night.

Oporto, Dec. 21.—Steamer LOANDA captured by Portuguese authorities and placed in port. She was buckled as a result of collision with steamer Orania. She is appointed steamer to transport cargo.—Lloyd's Agents per Salvage Association.

**ORANIA**—Oporto, Dec. 23.—Steamer Orania sunk, lying 85 deg. to port, submerged at high water all but 10 ft. and approximately in middle of harbour with nearest fixed point suitable for uprighting tackles over 600 metres, therefore tackles impracticable. Possibly some cargo on high side still dry but all cargo presently inaccessible. Salvage probably practicable but long and costly and requiring careful calculation and consideration.—Salvage Association's Special Officer.

**ORANIA**—Oporto, Jan. 10.—There is no further change in the position of the vessel. This may be due to her having reached bottom at an angle.
