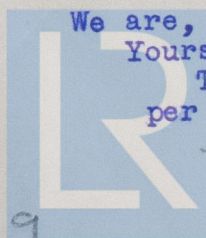

On enquiry of the Owners' Local Representatives we were informed that she had been sold as she lay to Messrs. Hughes Bolckow Shipbreaking Co. who had themselves removed her to Blyth for breaking up.
