S. I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 23rd instant having further reference to the steamer "DUMFRIES", from which I note that you now have a firm offer from Buyers who wish to take delivery as and where she lies at Bideford, and that it is their intention to break her up at Newport, Mon., where she will be towed from her present position for the purpose.

In reply to your enquiry regarding obtaining a certificate of seaworthiness for the voyage from Bideford to Newport, I have to inform you that this could be furnished provided the hull be generally examined by one of the Society's Surveyors and favourably reported upon, together with the main boiler on which steam is proposed to be raised for the purpose of raising the anchors and auxiliary use generally.

The fee for the survey would be the same as mentioned in the last paragraph of my letter of the 3rd instant.

I shall be glad to learn as soon as possible whether you desire the survey to be proceeded with.
