Dear Sir,,

In reply to your letter of the 23rd inst, regarding the case of the Tug "SIMS" Hull report No. 31635, I beg to state that the Special Survey mark was recommended in this case on account of the amount of work done to the vessel after it was decided to put her into class, and although the requirements of footnote B. table 1 of the Rules for Composite vessel had not been carried out as to felt or canvas being placed between the steel frames and the oak planking with this exception the remainder of the workmanship was examined under special survey and found satisfactory in every way.

With regard to the thick strakes of planking at the bilge, I beg to state that three strakes of planking are noted as on the approved section.
