Sir,

I am directed to acquaint you for the information of the Glasgow Committee that the classings of the ships named in the Glasgow & Greenock Reports of Survey (Nos. 20521 to 20534 & 20536 to 20543 & Crk.No.13538) were confirmed by the General Committee at their meeting today.

I have also to state that the Extract forwarded by you from the Minutes of the monthly meeting of the Glasgow Committee on Tuesday last were read to the General Committee.

I have at the same time to acquaint you that the General Committee had before them the Glasgow First Entry Reports of classification (No.20487) on the steamer "OANFA". In view of the fact that all the sea connections with the deep ballast tank just abaft the machinery space have now been satisfactorily cut off, and of the Owners having undertaken not to use this compartment as a tank without the Committee being notified thereof, the Committee decided to class the vessel $\text{£}100 \text{ A1}$, with notations of $\text{£}1\text{MC } 12, 02$, Lloyd's A.&G.P.
