The Pacific Steam Navigation Co, Managers of the vessel, examine the S.S. 'MEMPHIS' 7074 tons gross, No. 20577 in the Register Book, in order to ascertain her general condition.

Attended on January the 22nd 1920 the vessel being afloat in the Brocklebank Dock here, and subsequently when in Canada Dry Dock.

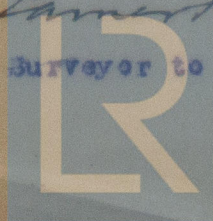
The bottom and rudder and chain cables examined in dry dock, holds, tween decks, engine & boiler space, bunkers, peaks, double bottom tanks, decks, hatchways, covers and supports, masts and rigging, windlass, steering gear, pumps, W.T. Doors, casings, ventilators and general equipment examined as far as practicable, and all found in good condition.

Chain cables ranged and examined, found 270 fms  $2\frac{1}{2}$  in dia. in good condition.

Anchors:- 3 bowers, 1 stream and 1 kedge in good condition.

Judging from my examination, and after reading Mr A.F. Smith's Condition Survey report dated Valparaiso October 2nd 1919 I am of opinion that the vessel is in a fit condition to run for a further period of six months from February 1920.
