CLASSIFICATION OF VESSELS LAID UP.

With reference to my letter of the 21st April last, in which it was stated that the Committee had decided to request the Owners of the steamer "EBURNA" (No.19685 in Reg.Bk.) to furnish the usual undertaking as the vessel was laid up, I beg to acquaint you that the Sub-Committee of Classification have to-day had before them a request from the Owners to send the vessel from Singapore to Japan to be broken up, and that this proposal has been agreed to, subject to a satisfactory general examination being made of the vessel by the Society's Surveyor at Singapore.

In the circumstances, a note is being made at the foot of the list of vessels laid up under an undertaking to the following effect, viz:-

"Vessel allowed to proceed to Japan to be broken up, subject to her satisfactorily undergoing a general examination before sailing from Singapore".
